UUM Hosts the Transnational Climate Change Erasmus+ Project Meeting

University Utara Malaysia (UUM) hosted the fifth Transnational Meeting of the Erasmus+ Project on Curriculum Development for Climate Change Policy and Law (CCP-LAW). Held from April 23rd to 25th, 2024, the event brought together key international stakeholders from various institutions to discuss the progress of the CCP-LAW project, share best practices, and strengthen partnerships. The meeting concluded with a scientific visit to the UNESCO Global Geopark in Langkawi Island on April 27th, 2024, providing delegates with a unique opportunity to explore the impacts of climate change in a natural setting. A total of 32 delegates from 10 CCP_Law Team Members across six countries participated in the meeting. In addition to UUM, other participating institutions included: European Knowledge Spot and PEDMEDE (Greece), Coventry University (UK), Universitat de Girona (Spain), Hanoi Law University and Hue University (Vietnam), Marwadi University and Symbiosis International (India), International Islamic University Malaysia.

Project Progress

The first day of the meeting (April 23rd) began with a Progress Report session by all Work Package where participants shared the latest updates and discussed the next steps in the project. This session was crucial for evaluating the current status of the CCP-Law project and ensuring that each team is aligned with the project's goals.

Capacity Building Workshop

On the second day (April 24th), two significant capacity-building sessions were conducted by Universitat de Girona and Coventry University. These sessions focused on the delivery of the Lifelong Learning course on climate change policy and law, where participants received hands-on training on how to upload and organize their materials on the project platform. These sessions emphasized the importance of creating a robust and accessible platform for educational content, enabling participants to gain practical skills in course material management.

On the third day (April 25th), delegates met with UUM’s management team at the Chancellery Building. The session began with a welcome speech by UUM’s Deputy Vice-Chancellor for Research & Innovation, Prof. Dr. Russayani Ismail, followed by a speech from CCP-Law coordinator Prof. Dr. Do Thi Xuan Dung. The meeting also included a briefing on UUM’s campus sustainability initiatives by Assoc. Prof. Dr. Masnita Misiran @ Bakun, Director of the Centre for Testing, Measurement, and Evaluation (CeTMA). These initiatives align with the CCP-Law project’s focus on climate change mitigation and sustainable development. The meeting concluded with a tour of UUM’s facilities, including the Sultanah Bahiyah Library, UUM Management Museum, U-Assist, and the School of Law’s Climate Change Law Research Unit (CLIMATE).

Langkawi Geopark Educational Trip

To conclude the meeting, delegates participated in an educational trip to the UNESCO Global Geopark in Langkawi on April 26th and 27th, where they explored the impacts of climate change on local ecosystems. The visit included key sites such as Kilim Karst Geoforest Park, providing insights into the role of mangroves in coastal protection, the effects of shifting rainfall on freshwater resources, and ongoing conservation efforts. This real-world experience will enrich the CCP-Law curriculum by incorporating practical examples of climate change mitigation and adaptation strategies.
