Launching the CCPLAW Pilot Programme

The upcoming pilot phase of the **CCPLAW Programme**, which will run from **mid-September to the end of December 2024** marks a major milestone in the development of the **master’s course in Climate Change Policy and Law (CCPLAW)**, designed through the collaboration of Asian and European partners under the Erasmus+ initiative. It is a unique opportunity for law students in Asia to engage with cutting-edge climate change policy and law education.

Objectives of the Pilot

The primary aim of the CCPLAW pilot is to conduct a **small-scale test** of the master’s course, which focuses on key issues of climate change policy and law. This test will help assess the **reliability, objectivity, validity, feasibility, and overall effectiveness** of the course. During the pilot, universities will simulate the course’s delivery process, identifying potential challenges and areas for improvement. The process will also allow the participating institutions to anticipate **frequently asked questions**, address any weaknesses in the system, and better prepare for full-scale implementation.

This pilot will be crucial in determining whether the curriculum meets the academic and practical needs of students, while also ensuring it is aligned with the evolving needs of climate law professionals.

Expected Outcomes

The pilot will be a **simulation of the recognition process**, guiding partners through each stage of course delivery and helping to evaluate its strengths and weaknesses. The pilot will also involve:

- **Assessments and evaluations** to track the course’s progress.
- Real-time identification of challenges and **feedback mechanisms** to refine the curriculum.
- The generation of key insights into the effectiveness of the teaching methods and course structure.

Ultimately, this will help ensure the programme’s readiness for broader implementation across the region, providing a comprehensive approach to **climate change policy and law education**.

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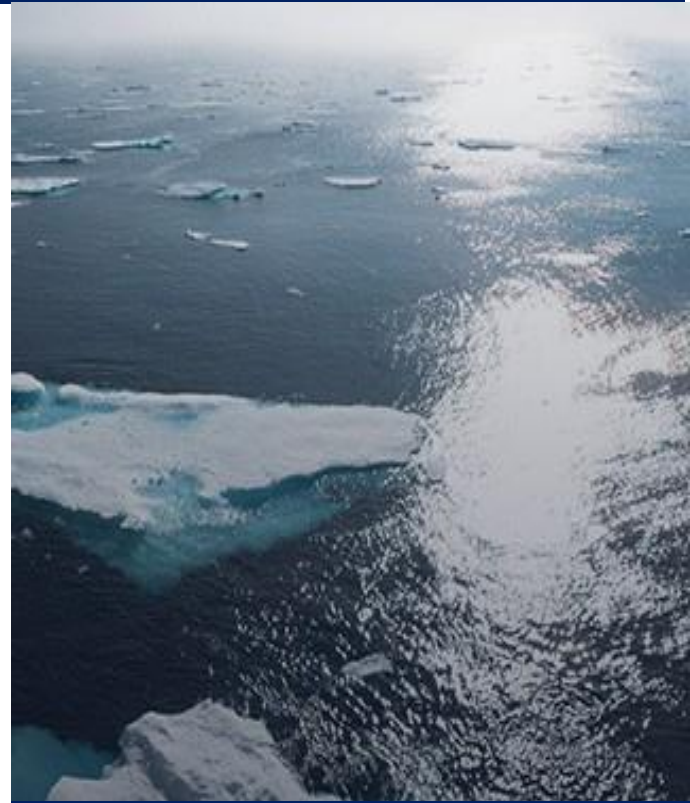

CCPLAW Pilot Programme Implementation

The curriculum for the CCPLAW Master's course has been carefully developed in collaboration between **Asian and European institutions** and offers a wide range of subjects. During the pilot phase, students will engage with selected **15 ECTS credits** worth of modules, chosen from the following areas:

1. **Climate Change Policy**
2. **Climate Change Governance**
3. **Climate Change Ethics**
4. **International Environmental and Climate Change Law**
5. **EU Environmental and Climate Change Law**
6. **Climate Change and Waste Law**
7. **Climate Change and Human Rights**
8. **Climate Change and Migration**
9. **Climate Change Dispute Resolution**
10. **Corporate Governance and Climate Change**
11. **The Science of Climate Change: Mitigation and Adaptation**

A total of six prestigious Asian universities are participating in this pilot, with **90-120 students** expected to take part. Each institution will select **15-20 students** to experience the new curriculum:

- **Hue University (HU)** – COORDINATOR
- **Hanoi Law University (HLU)**
- **Symbiosis International (SIU)**
- **Marwadi University (MU)**
- **University Utara Malaysia (UUM)**
- **International Islamic University (IIUM)**
